“Our intention is to encourage schools to be involved in the Bike to School Day celebration and to give parents and teachers bike safety information to pass along to the students,” says Sara Sundquist, Shasta County Safe Routes to School Coordinator. Participants that attend the training will learn how to fit helmets and will receive helmets to give to students who are in need. Participants will also get information on how to coordinate bike safety and Bike to School Day events, including information on how to form “bike trains,” a supervised group of students riding to school. This strategy reduces traffic congestion around the school entrance and gets students to be active before their school day.
