

REDDING CULTURAL DISTRICT WALKING ROUTES

DOWNTOWN REDDING

SHOWCASING DOWNTOWN REDDING, WHICH SITS ON THE HOMELANDS OF THE EL-POM WINTU PEOPLE, THE CITY'S HISTORIC AND ARCHITECTURAL PAST, AND ITS EMERGING CULTURE AND ARTS.

From the **Shasta Bike Depot**, former site of the 1 **Bell Rooms**, follow California St. south. Turning right onto Yuba St., you will find the **train depot** (c.1923), from Redding's history (est. 1872) as a railroad town; **Lorenz Hotel** (c.1902), built with gold rush wealth and now senior housing; and 2 **Library Park**, once Carnegie Library now a food truck park. Return to California St. and notice the development across the street where the **former Golden Eagle Hotel** hosted conversations that led to Wintu cultural preservation and the signing of the Wintu Yana Petition, a milestone in their ongoing pursuit of justice. Choose a loop as you head south. Each loop features local makers, creative spaces, and great eats.

Long loop: Continue down California St. to 3 the **Riverfront Playhouse** and **Calaboose Creek**. From there, follow the curve of HWY 273 south and carefully cross at Lincoln St. toward Pine St. Take Pine St. north, turn left on South St., and turn onto Market St., toward 4.

Short loop: Turn left onto Placer St. and right onto Market St. for the beautiful Art Deco 4 Cascade Theater (c.1935). Head up Market St. to experience blocks of historic, modern, and functional art. After 5 Umbrella Alley (seasonal), take the first right and walk to the next alley for a lighted 3D mural, 6 Electric Alley. Continue east to Pine St. and north to Butte St. Bearing left, reenter Market St. at a historic intersection with 7 the IOOF (Independent Order of Odd Fellows) Hall (c.1888), Redding's oldest brick structure which houses VIVA Downtown, Bank of Shasta County building (c.1904), and Shasta Historical Society (c.1902). After taking in the sights, continue north to Tehama St. and turn right. Head north on Pine St. to Shasta St. and turn left to take in the Art Moderne style Redding Fire House (c.1939). Then explore 8 Old City Hall/Shasta Arts Council (c.1907). Continue west from Shasta St. to Center St. and circle the block to appreciate the revitalization and murals of the 9 Red Brick District, once Redding's tenderloin including 1.
